PERILOUS TIMES

"This know also, that in the last days perilous times shall come." 2 Timothy 3:1

If you were born and raised in America, you can't remember a time when sin was more rampant than now. Recently I read an article in the newspaper about a movie that is expected to win awards in that industry. It is a story of two homosexual cowboys and their abominable relationship. The debates in public education about creationism, intelligent design, and evolution are merely letters of an epitaph being engraved on America's tombstone. The America that many of us have known since childhood is fast fading away and being replaced by a revised version. Some say we are more free than ever because of our toleration of sins such as abortion, homosexuality, pornography, etc., but that is not true. What has happened is that the wicked rule. Freedoms now being passed out are not really liberties being give to oppressed people. No, let's call these so called liberties what they really are - "A license to sin."

Our government didn't create new liberties with the homosexual marriage issue, or abortion on demand, or first amendment rights for Hollywood and the pornography industry. They just took rights away from another group in society and gave them to these. They took away an infant's right to life when they gave the mother the liberty to kill them at any time before birth. They took away the rights of an innocent child to be protected by society from being placed in the home of people who are sexually perverted when they allowed homosexuals to adopt. They took away the rights of the upright when they allowed filth to be promoted on the internet. Why should a family with children have to buy a blocking system to protect them from ungodliness? These are the last days, the "Perilous Times," and if the church does not affect the culture, the culture will affect the church. Think about

Paul did not tell Timothy how to avoid perilous times, HE SIMPLY DESCRIBED THEM SO TIMO-THY WOULD KNOW WHEN THEY ARRIVED; and he counseled Timothy on how he should carry on his Christian duty in those times. Many sermons could be preached on the description Paul gives us in chapter 3, but I want to focus on the warning he states in chapter 4. Notice verses 3 and 4, "For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; And they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables." Paul is not referring just to the lost crowd outside the church, he is talking about the professing crowd inside the church as well.

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"We are journeying unto the place of which the LORD said, I will give it you: come thou with us, and we will do thee good." Numbers 10:29

The greatest barrier between some Christians and God's omnipotent power is their own supposed strength.

Spiritual health, revival, overcoming, whatever name you want to call it, depends on a commitment to hear and obey the truth.

By the way, do you appreciate me reminding you of this? Your answer will give a good indication of how severely you have been affected by these last days. Note the warning: "For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine" (verse 3a). They will not tolerate sound teaching! The word "sound" is the same word translated "whole" when Jesus said, "The whole need not a physician..." "Whole" means healthy. "They will not tolerate wholesome teaching," which means they become spiritual junk food junkies.

The majority of professing Christians today only like two types of sermons. First, the type that is all about them. It makes God a sugar daddy or a glorified bellhop that caters to their every want, or second, the type that straightens other people out. It tells off those whose conduct they dislike, but never touches on their personal failures.

I'm not saying that everything should be negative and you had better like it. However, in the last days there is a danger of becoming like Ahab and only wanting someone to prophesy good concerning you, and if they don't, you hate them or the message. I'm sure most of you know this, but you need to be reminded that the merit of preaching is not based on how well you liked what the preacher had to say. Notice how the warning continues...

"but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears." Those who won't tolerate healthy biblical teaching will accumulate a special group of preachers that will preach the things that suit their liking.

When real Holy Ghost revival comes to an individual's experience, they want to hear holiness and clean living preached; but more than that they want to hear the serious matters of the heart **preached.** They want to know what 1 Corinthians 13 means for them to do. They want to understand their obligation to the teaching of the Sermon on the Mount. They want to hear expositions on Romans 12, 1 Corinthians 11, or Galatians 5, to mention only a few. Those who will not tolerate it look for a place where it is not taught.

Notice the warning continues, "And they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables." Those who only want to hear what they want to hear, will stop their ears, no longer listening to the truth, and will wander off after man-made fiction.

Anyone who has been in church very long, has seen the people described by verses 3 and 4, especially in recent days. Modern church growth experts have written dozens of books in response to this trend on how to build a church in these perilous times. The problem with most of these authors' growth plan is it mostly involve ear scratching, (verse 3), and following a lot of man-made fiction (verse 4).

Paul didn't confine himself just to

telling Timothy what to look out for, HE ADVISED HIM WHAT TO **DO IN PERILOUS TIMES.** Note the charge in 4:1, "I charge thee therefore before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, who shall judge the quick and the dead at his appearing and his kingdom." Paul is saying "I give you charge of this responsibility based on the fact that Jesus is coming, and when He arrives He will judge people who died before He came and those alive when He arrives, and from among them set up His Kingdom." In other words, "Timothy, remember Jesus is going to judge us on the merit of our faithfulness, not how successful we appear in our times; so don't let anything but your love and reverence for Jesus dictate where you stand."

Notice further that the charge continues in verse 2, "Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all long suffering and doctrine." Paul lists the essential things that Timothy must do, no matter which way the tide of popular opinion turns. "Preach the word"- just stick with the Word. Illustrate it, expound it, but stick with it. "Be instant in season, out of season"- never lose your sense of urgency, but press the message of the gospel home at every opportunity. "Reprove"- explain biblically your feelings of disapproval. "Rebuke"- boldly point out what or who is to blame. "Long suffering and doctrine"- do it with all the patience that teaching spiritual things require.

Notice the charge continue still further in verse 5, "But watch thou in all things, endure afflictions, do thy

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work of an evangelist, make full proof of thy ministry." Paul didn't say anything about using stacking chairs instead of pews, praise and worship choruses sung off the wall, changing the translation of the Bible, or just becoming user-friendly. No, in fact he said something that contradicts the very notion that change is the answer to changing times. Verses 1 and 2 are what he charges Timothy to do leading up to perilous times, and verse 5 is what he tells him to do once in the midst of perilous times. "but watch thou in all things." In other words, "stand fast, calm, and sane in whatever you are doing, no matter what happens." In a sense, Paul is telling Timothy to watch and be careful as he carries on his work, but not to let anything move him from his purpose.

Then Paul tells Timothy to "endure afflictions." This means to "face whatever hardship comes and endure any suffering your standing fast in the truth requires." If nobody listens, don't change the message.

Yet again, he counsels Timothy to "Do the work of an evangelist." This means "go on spreading the gospel. Keep telling the old, old story." Remember there is a vast difference between getting someone to come to church and getting someone to come to Christ.

Finally, he instructs Timothy, "Make full proof of your ministry." That is, "carry out your commission and fulfill all the duties of your calling." A preacher does not have to resort to carnal business practices to succeed in ministry, but he does have to know what God expects of him and then do it with all his heart.

You may be thinking, "Brother Taylor, all you have done is told me something I already knew." I realized that when I started, but remember the most perilous thing about the "Perilous Times" is that the devil is trying to deceive you into changing your mind!

Finally, after much hesitation and with many fears, he began to creep cautiously across the surface of the ice on his hands and knees. About halfway over he heard the sound of singing behind him. Out of the dusk there came a man, driving a horse-drawn load of coal across the ice and singing merrily as he went his way.

Here he was on his hands and knees, trembling lest the ice be not strong enough to bear him up! And there, as if whisked away by the winter's wind, went the man, his horses, his sleigh, and his load of coal, upheld by the same ice on which he was creeping!

Like this weary traveler, some of us have learned only to creep upon the promises of God. Cautiously, timidly, trembling we venture forth upon His promises, as though the lightness of our step might make His promises more secure. As though we could contribute even in

When minister Joe Wright was asked to open the new session of the Kansas Senate, everyone was expecting the usual generalities, but this is what they heard:

"Heavenly Father, we come before you today to ask your forgiveness and to seek your direction and guidance. 'Woe to those who call evil good,' but that is exactly what we have done. We have lost our spiritual equilibrium and reversed our values.

We have exploited the poor and called it the lottery.

We have rewarded laziness and called it welfare.

We have killed our unborn and called it choice

We have shot abortionist and called it justifiable.

We have neglected to discipline our children and called it building self esteem.

We have abused power and called it politics.

We have coveted our neighbors possessions and called it ambition.

We have polluted the air with profanity and pornography and called it freedom of expression.

We have ridiculed the time-honored values of our forefathers and called it enlightenment.

Search us, Oh God and know our hearts today; cleanse us from every sin and set us free. Amen!"

The response was immediate. A number of legislators walked out during the prayer in protest. In 6 short weeks Central Christian Church, where Joe Wright is Pastor, logged more than 5,000 phone calls with only 47 of them responding negatively. The church is now receiving international requests for copies of the prayer from India, Africa, and Korea.

Commentator Paul Harvey aired this prayer on his radio program, "The Rest of the Story," and received a larger response to this program than any other he has ever aired.

May this prayer sweep over our nation and wholeheartedly become our desire so that we can again be called "one nation under God"
