Bethlehem - Birthplace of the Saviour

We understand that one of the things that distinguish God's Word from the writings of other religions is prophecy. There are multitudes of scriptures that are prophetic concerning the first and second comings of Jesus Christ to this earth. We as Christians safely and surely feel that because the Scriptures concerning the first coming of Christ to this earth, i.e., His birth, life, death, resurrection, and ascension back to heaven were fulfilled in the minutest of details, surely we can believe that the Scriptures in relation to His second coming, the Rapture and Revelation, will also take place as they are promised unto us in His Word, the Bible.

One of the Old Testament prophecies about His birth is found in Micah 5:2, "But thou, Bethlehem Ephratah, though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of thee shall he come forth unto me that is to be ruler in Israel; whose goings forth have been from of old, from everlasting." God through the Spirit spoke to holy men of old and pinpointed the place of the Messiah's birth as Bethlehem. Why did God choose this town that appears so small and insignificant in comparison with many of the great capitals of countries and kingdoms of that day. Only God knows for sure, but there are some very interesting facts about this little town of Bethlehem



we need to consider.

First, the name "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." Man may not realize or recognize the fact, but God knows that man has a hunger in his soul that only God can satisfy. John 6:35 says, "And Jesus said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst." From the House of Bread came the Bread of Life -Jesus Christ.

Secondly, Bethlehem had a well by the gate that David longed for while in a cave, 2 Samuel 23:13-17. David had a longing for natural water from the old home place, but God knows that man has a thirst, a craving in man's soul that only a born-again experience with God can quench. John 4:14 records these words of Jesus. "But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life." In Bethlehem's stable God uncapped the Well of Salvation - Jesus Christ, the Water of Life.

Thirdly, Bethlehem was the home of Boaz and Ruth. Boaz was the kinsman-redeemer that loved the Moabitess woman named Ruth. As a Moabitess, Ruth belonged to a cursed people who were enemies


