2004. A new year has begun. What will it hold for us. We don't know what storms we will face this year, but we do know that we will face them. The important thing in life is not to worry so much about the storm, but to make sure that our relationship is right with the Lord, who controls the storm.

Years ago a military officer and his wife were aboard a ship that was caught in a raging ocean storm. Seeing the frantic look in her eyes, the man tried unsuccessfully to allay her fears. Suddenly she grasped his sleeve and cried, "How can you be so calm?" He stepped back a few feet and drew his sword. Pointing it at her heart, he said, "Are you afraid of this?" Without hesitation she answered, "Of course not!" "Why not?" he inquired. "Because it's in your hand, and you love me too much to hurt me." To this he replied, "I know the One who holds the winds and the waters in the hollow of His hand, and He will surely care for us!" The officer was not disturbed because he had put his trust in the Lord.

How different life would be if we could put all of our trust in the Lord, and never doubt that He would come through for us. It doesn't matter how big the storm is, it doesn't matter how impossible Satan makes things look, God is BIGGER, and nothing is impossible with Him!

It looked like the end for Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego as king Nebuchadnezzar was about to throw them into the fiery furnace. If we look at Daniel 3:16,17, & 18 we read, "Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, answered and said to the king, O Nebuchadnezzar, we are not careful to answer thee in this matter. If it be so, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and he will deliver us out of thine hand, O king. But if not, be it known unto thee, O king, that we will not serve thy gods, nor worship the golden image which thou hast set up."

Notice in verse 16, "we are not careful to answer thee in this matter." The word careful meaning the same as chuwsh (koosh) in the Hebrew dictionary, to be eager with excitement or enjoyment, to make haste, to be ready.

This year no doubt Satan will come along and tell you, this is it, it's all over, there is nothing God can do, you're going down for the last time. When he does, be like the three Hebrews, and be ready with excitement, and make haste to let him know that the God you serve is bigger than anything he can come up with. You may go through the fire this year, but you won't be alone. The Lord will be there right by your side.

The words of Isaiah 43:1-3 can be of great comfort to you when it looks like all is in despair. "But now thus saith the LORD that created thee, O Jacob, and he that formed thee, O Israel, Fear not: for I have redeemed thee, I have called thee by

As many of you know, Sis. Gail's health has required several hospitalizations over the past two years. We thank you for your expressions of love and concern for her welfare. It has meant so much to her as well as the board. We are saddened to report that in November, Dr. John Worrell, her personal physician, informed the board that from now on Sis. Gail would require constant care. Dr. Worrell also instructed Sis. Gail and the board that he definitely did not want her driving. At which time, he said that Sis. Gail needed professional management of her prescribed medications. He suggested Briarcliff Assisted Living Center in McAllen where Sis. Gail is currently living. At Dr. Worrell's insistence, she was willing to make the transition. If you would like to send cards and letters, use the same address as always. We will forward them on to Sis. Gail. It would mean so much to Sis. Gail to hear from the saints. If you would like to contribute to the expense of her care, please indicate so on your offering. We are committed to providing the best care possible in view of all her sacrifices. "For God is not unrighteous to forget your work and labor of love...." (Hebrews 6:10)

We, the Holiness people, owe a great debt to Sis. Gail Myers. To many of us she was the first missionary we had ever met. She changed the way many people felt about missions, causing them to realize the need of supporting the work on the foreign fields. She always came equipped with many pictures and slides. She even brought native workers to the states with her; thereby transforming the mindset of the Holiness people. Over the

past 50 years, the Holiness people have begun to support many missionaries whom we also support.

Now, as this ministry enters a new phase, there are some things that we, the board, feel that the supporters should know. Because Sis. Gail hasn't been able to travel to the states and visit the churches, the support has declined somewhat. We have had reports from some that have said that if Sis. Gail is no longer able to travel, they will transfer their support to someone else. If you are contemplating discontinuing support of Holiness Full Gospel Missions, Inc., we encourage you to first consider these facts. In the past 50 years, approximately 170 works have been either pioneered by Sis. Gail or have joined the fellowship. The churches in Mexico, Panama and Columbia are financially supported by the people of the United States. This great work is a gift by Sis. Gail to the Holiness people.

We all have a large investment in this work. In some churches in Mexico, as many as four generations are involved. If we drop our support, other denominations are ready to step in. Bro. Frankie in Panama has been approached, as well as some pastors in Mexico. These other denominations are more than willing to take up where we leave off Some preachers were offered more monthly support than we give, but because of their commitment to the Holiness doctrine, they declined the offers. We, the board, know this is a fact. Please understand this work needs your support now more than ever before. The saints you support in these three countries suffer from

severe poverty, and are dependent upon us for their basic needs. We feel that we should continue to make a "certain contribution" as Paul did for the poor saints which were at Jerusalem. Gail told the Mexican board a few years ago, "No new construction."

thy name; thou art mine. man had the duty to raise a drawbridge to allow the steamers to pass on the river below and to lower it again for trains to cross over on land. Suddenly, the boy lost his footing and tumbled into the gears. As the father tried to reach down and pull him out, he heard the whistle of an approaching train. He knew the train would be full of people and that it would be impossible to stop the fast-moving locomotive, therefore, the bridge must be lowered! A terrible dilemma confronted him: if he saved the people, his son would be crushed in the cogs. Frantically, he tried to free the boy, but to no avail. Finally, the father put his hand to the lever that would start the machinery. He paused and then, with tears he pulled it. The giant gears began to work and the bridge clamped down just in time to save the train. The passengers, not knowing what the father had done, were laughing and making merry; yet the bridgekeeper had chosen to save their lives at the cost of his son's.

In all of this there is a parable: the heavenly Father, too, saw the blessed Savior being nailed to a cross while people laughed and mocked and spit upon Him and yet, "He spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all."
