Habakkuk's Prayer (A Prayer for America)

"O Lord, I have heard thy speech, and was afraid: 0 Lord, revive thy work in the midst of the years, in the midst of the years make known; in wrath remember mercy."

So prays the prophet Habakkuk in chapter 3, verse 2 of his book in the bible. Habakkuk looked at his people and saw violence, strife, and contention. It frustrated him to see that the people who should be living holy and set apart were instead living in sin. So the prophet complains to God because he couldn't understand why the Lord would allow such evil to continue unpunished. God reveals His plan of judgement to Habakkuk and he begans to pray differently. At first Habakkuk was ready for God to execute swift judgment, but when he sees just how serious God's judgment really is, he prays that the Lord will remember mercy even in His wrath.

Habakkuk is praying for Israel, but when we compare Old Testament Israel with the United States of America, it's not hard to find similarities. Israel was a nation God chose to be set apart and to serve him. It seemed that time after time they would come up against incredible odds and God would give them the victory because his mighty hand was upon them. After awhile however, Israel turned their back on God and forgetting the one who had brought them so far, they turned to wicked ways. So God sent judgment. The bible says in Psalm 9:17, "The wicked shall be turned into hell, and all the nations that forget God." God always loved Israel but God will not bless sin.

It seems to me that God has especially blessed America. We're a mighty nation now, but it hasn't always been this way. In its beginnings our nation was far from a superpower, yet we won victories that can only be explained by a help from a higher power. I love this country, I think it's the best place to live in the world, yet I'm saddened because we've been turning away from the God that blessed us. What's even more sad, is that while this great nation has been moving away from God, there are many in the church who have done little or nothing to stop it.

I've heard that it has been taught that Christians should stay away from politics and out of government. Some

Christians don't even vote. Friends, that attitude is a dangerous one. If you wish to nit pick and falsely accuse everyone, then the Word of God can't help you. Neither can any other minister help you. ome time ago, we visited a "charis-Omatic church" on a Sunday morning. We were on vacation and needed a place to go to church. We went to the young adult Sunday school class. The teacher picked up the lesson that morning and started into some doctrinal issues that should have been fairly smooth sailing for established Christians. It was anything but smooth sailing. Debate over the subject led to one of the most disturbing things I have ever witnessed One by one the members of the class offered their preferred version of the Bible. Instead of answering the question this led to a dismissal of the doctrine completely. This basic Bible doctrine was totally ignored as truth because the versions would not agree upon the same answer. In our times the Word of God is under a great assault from some of the very ones who claim to live under its guidelines for salvation and doctrine.

In our text for this study we see a young man in the way of life. The word cleanse implies that the young man is polluted and therefore needs to be purified. We know that sin is the reason for all pollution in our lives. What is there for this young man that will not only identify sin but also bring hope of cleansing as well. There are many who are more than willing to identify the failures in our youth today. They stand ready to blast the failures and shortcomings of one of the most vulnerable groups of people. Its not the case in every situation but most of the time the reason for corruption in the youth is the failure of the former generation to establish absolute guidelines to follow. Anyone can point to the failures but can we provide an answer to the moral decay of our generation. The writer says there is cleansing for the young man by taking heed unto the Word of God. Not only is there cleansing but according to the text there is direction for his way by hiding the Word of God in his heart.

Our youth need to know there is a moral compass in this immoral world. While peer

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pressure mounts for them to conform to the modem position of right and wrong we need to declare the absolute authority of the Word of God. The truths contained in the Bible are not up for debate nor do they need to be revised to fit our culture. They are timeless truths for all generations. God has not

changed his mind on sin! A young man or young lady must realize the necessity of knowing the Bible. A preacher was confronting a woman about the sin in her life. He offered to show her what the Bible said about the subject. She said, "No, don't show me what the Bible says or I will have to do it. "How foolish can someone be? It was also reported that only 34% of those young people had a goal of attending church on a regular basis. The seriousness of our times cannot be overstated. We need to establish the absolutes of our day. The Word of God is without question an absolute authority. There are people in our world who are attempting to do away with all absolutes. They will try to convince you that there is no right or wrong.

Throughout history, anytime there was a decrease in the amount of truth being preached, there was also an increase in the evils committed. If absolutes are slowly done away with we will see, and have already seen, an increase in the corruption

> of moral values. The modern church world has began to put its approval on things the Word of God declares are an abomination. Once there is a pendulum shift or a change of direction it is extremely hard to correct that course of action. It is a necessity that we de-

to be absolute truth no matter what we are labeled. Many have already suffered shipwreck from this dangerous spirit of compromise.

May we as holiness young people take a stand for the absolute truth of the Word of God. Romans 3: 4. Let God be true. but every man a liar ... When it comes to the point where a stand must be taken we must declare without fear or favor that the Holy Bible is absolute truth.

MOM'S LEGACY ...Our mother, Mona Page was saved at the age of 12 and totally surrendered her life to the Lord at the age of 14. Mom was raised by her grandparents, Mark and Vian Yelton. Her Grandmother was a strict Free Will Baptist woman and very influential in teaching Mom about the Lord. I am sure that neither Mom nor Grandma Yelton realized this would begin a journey that would last for 59 years.

When Mom committed her life at 14 to serve the Lord, He became first in her life. Mom played the guitar. She and a group of young people would walk to church, playing their guitars and singing all the way there. By the time they got to church they were ready for worship. She read her Bible daily and prayed, asking God to guide her heart in what was right and wrong and to help her make good decisions. That dedication prepared her for the plan that God had for her life.

When she was 17, she met and married our Dad, Carl Page, a union that would begin 56 years of service to the Lord as they pastured 10 churches over the years and preached many meetings across the country. They made many long-lasting friendships.

So many of you have been to visit or sent cards and e-mails. We have read or heard, "Sis. Mona, you were a blessing to our family," or "You helped me when I was discouraged," or "You were there when I needed someone to pray with me."

Mom was a fighter. She would cheer on that young pastor and his wife that were discouraged. I've seen her pull out the skillet and cook many meals for those that needed a friend and needed to feel like they belonged somewhere. When all four of her children turned their backs on God, she fought for her own. Daddy tells about the time that he woke up and Mom wasn't in bed. He found her outside under the mercury light, praying, fighting for her children. There were nights that she would lay her hand on the Bible and say, "Satan, you aren't getting my children." She continued this

until, one by one, we found our way back home.

Although she was a pastor/ministers wife, she was also our mother. She learned right a way that there would need to be a balancing act to be both there for us, and for the church people she loved so much. We, the Page children, like so many other pastor's children, learned that, as a servant for God, we would need to share her with many others.

Our mother left a heritage for each of us to inherit in our own way. We all want to pattern our spiritual lives after hers. When she came to church, she came to worship. You would hear her clap her hands or say "Amen", or "Bless him, Lord."

I find it remarkable that the generation of Israelites called stubborn and "stiff-necked," (Ex. 32:9) and who were condemned to die in the wilderness because of their unbelief, raised the generation of Israelites that served God and conquered Canaan under the leadership of Joshua. This goes against the rule that ungodly parents tend to raise ungodly children.

It even becomes more remarkable to me that the generation that conquered and settled the promised land under the leadership of Joshua, raised a generation that didn't know or obey God. This goes against the rule that godly parents tend to raise godly children.

As a whole it seems that the children whose parents wandered in the desert for 40 years fared better than those

whose parents raised them in the promised land. Look at what happened to that generation who were for the most part raised in the Promised land:

Judges 2:7: And the people served the LORD all the days of Joshua, and all the days of the elders that outlived Joshua, who had seen all the great works of the LORD, that he did for Israel.

8 And Joshua the son of Nun, the servant of the LORD, died, being an hundred and ten years old.

9 And they buried him in the border

of his inheritance in Timnathheres, in the mount of Ephraim, on the north side of the hill Gaash.

10 And also all that generation were gathered unto their fathers: and there arose another generation after them, which knew not the LORD, nor yet the works which he had done for Israel.

11 And the children of Israel did evil in the sight of the LORD, and served Baalim:

12 And they forsook the LORD God of their fathers, which brought them out of the land of Egypt, and followed other gods, of the gods of the people that were round about them, and bowed themselves unto them, and provoked the LORD to anger.

13 And they forsook the LORD, and served Baal and Ashtaroth.

There are lessons for us to learn as we look at the **Perils of Parenting in the Promised Land.**

Firstly let's learn from the generation who were shut out of Canaan because of their unbelief. When this people first came to the border of Canaan they saw only the walled cities and the giants and forgot that God had promised them the land. They murmured against Moses and his leadership and were doomed to wander in the wilderness for 40 years and until their generation died out. Though these parents had made mistakes that would forever affect their own future. yet their children saw the providence of God in the lives of their parents in their wilderness journey. It does not take a perfect parent to raise good children, but we must be honest about our mistakes show repentance and still allow our children to see the hand of God in our life. I pray that any parent who has made mistakes in their adult life, please don't just give up. Do your best to right your wrong and for the sale of your children go on and try to do the right thing. God will still give you miracles in the desert which was caused by vour mistakes!

Let's move on the next generation. It is a fact that with the parents who raised their children in Canaan, God just became a story instead of an experience.

The word "knew" in Judges 2:10, does not mean that they did not know about God but that they DID NOT KNOW HIM PERSONALLY! Moses foresaw this danger and warned them in Deuteronomy, chapter 6, verse 10: And it shall be, when the LORD thy God shall have brought thee into the land which he sware unto thy fathers, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, to give thee great and goodly cities, which thou buildedst not,

11 And houses full of all good things, which thou filledst not, and wells digged, which thou diggedst not, vineyards and olive trees, which thou plantedst not; when thou shalt have eaten and be full;

12: Then beware lest thou forget the LORD, which brought thee forth out of the land of Egypt, from the house of bondage.

This generation that forgot God and served Baal, knew in their history that there forefathers had been led out of Egypt and God had made a path for them across the sea. Yet, for them it was a story and not an experience. Moses told the people that if (De 6:5) "thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might.

6 And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart:"

What Moses was telling them was if they would live the commandments and keep them in the heart, God would not just be a story but an experience.

IT is a fact that with the parents who raised their children in Canaan, God was forgotten because of the prosperity of

their times.

When the people came into Canaan, they drank from wells they didn't dig, ate crops they didn't plant and lived in houses they didn't build. The miraculous providence of Manna, ceased when and they ate of the corn of that land. They no longer needed the a miraculous wind to pile up quails, or water to burst from a rock. They now could plant crops in fertile soil and harvest those crops and eat the fruit of their own labor. Most of the major wars had been fought and it was a prosperous time for the people. Moses had warned them emphatically to not forget God in those times of prosperity. Yet, because hardship didn't demand

reliance upon God they began to forget Him. God never did intend that the blessed life of Canaan would become a life of ease and indifference.

For the average American parent, raising children in our prosperous culture is akin to the perils that those parents faced raising their children

in the prosperity of Canaan. It is so easy in our times to forget God, because we seldom face the hardship that demands reliance upon God. Some seem to think that to be a good parent they must remove all difficulty from the life of their child. You will contribute to the moral delinquency of your child if you give them a life of total ease. Go ahead and do the homework for your child, let them sit and play video games and never have to share in household responsibilities, give them all the money they want without having to work for it and I assure you that you will hate the result!!!

IT is a fact that the parents who raised their children in Canaan, had to contend with the peril of compromise.

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If you were a parent near 1390 B.C., you would have a nice house on a fruitful piece of property. The promised land was mostly settled, but there were still remnants of the nations and religions that God had taken the land from. You were commanded to not do business, intermarry or have anything to do with these heathen people. Yet these people and their religion seemed harmless for the most part. Did you really need to take the hard stance that God had commanded.? No doubt these questions plagued the minds of the Israelites because for a man to sin and do wrong, he must first question what is right. That generation raised in the

luxury of Canaan failed God and "forsook the LORD God of their fathers, which brought them out of the land of Egypt, and followed other gods, of the gods of the people that were round about them, and bowed themselves unto them, and provoked the LORD to anger (Judges 2:12)."

Parents, we in these times are facing this same peril of Parenting in the Promised land -the peril of compromise. God expects us to maintain our separation from this world and never have our children been bombarded with more things that will cause them to question the necessity of separation and holiness. Let's take the Highway of Holiness for our families.


